MEMBERSHIP REPORT FOR APRIL 2022

I want to start out by welcoming the newly installed Exalted Rulers. Part of your job this next year is to work on membership. First help bring new members to ELKDOM. Secondly keeping the members that you have by keeping them involved in all the fun activities and event you have (go Elkin). Thirdly, you need to be reaching out to those who just became an unaffiliated members. Exalted Rulers when you get to back to you lodges remind your lodge secretaries to review Section 14.180 of the Statues. Secretaries must contact all members dropped on March 31, 2022 for nonpayment. A letter must be sent out to each member was dropped at year end.

I sent out a reminder about a week ago to all lodges stating that we are half way through the 60 day reinstatement period that goes through May 31st. Those recently unaffiliated members who wish to reinstate during this period will be able to reinstate without having to pay the reinstatement fee and will not loose a year on their membership history. Members who reinstate after June 1st will be charged the reinstatement fee, loose a year of membership and will be required to be voted on by the lodge members.

We need to be reaching out to our newly unaffiliated members and try to bring them back in. To this end, Rick Gathen(Grand Lodge Membership & Marketing Manager) has put into play a direct mail piece that was aimed at those who are recently canceled members. Approximately 175 of these mailings have been designated for Utah. They have been mailed and should have arrived sometime this past week. This mailing is a reminder of the role that a member provides in supporting local, state and national programs and the ease of reinstating during this 60 day period as opposed to possibly reinstating later on,

Before I end this report, I want to let you know that I have reviewed our membership status for this past month, as of April 27, 2022 there has been only one reinstatement, ~~30~~³⁴ initiations with ~~89~~⁸⁶ candidates to be initiated. It has been a slow month and at this point I encourage you to work on both the reinstatement and initiations.


Be sure that your Social Quarters are up to date on all the proper certificates needed for serving alcohol and to be mindful of not over serving.
