Grillo, Past Grand Exalted Ruler and Robert L. Duitsman, Past Grand Exalted Ruler, I do hereby **ORDER**, **INSTRUCT** and **AUTHORIZE** the above-named Trustees of Defunct Richfield, Utah Lodge No. 2420 to **EXECUTE**, **TRANSFER** and **DELIVER** the assets held by them, in the amount of \$184,319.00 as of July 21, 2022, together with any subsequent accruals thereto, in the following manner:

Duitsman, shall be CONCLUDED, and the appointed Trustees shall be relieved of your duties and responsibilities.
