UTAH STATE FALL MEETING September 2022 VETERANS REPORT

The State Funds for the Veterans Homes in Utah were spent for the Ogden, Payson, Salt Lake and Ivins facilities to purchase Birthday Cakes, flowers for their gardens, fishing trips, birdseed, bird feeders and clothing.

The Ivins Home was closed to volunteers until August 15th. While closed, 10 volunteers from St George Veterans Committee were allowed to work outdoors at the nine patios and cleaned the 12 box gardens of weeds and planted 200 plants of different flowers. The veterans also requested birdseed for the various feeders and candy which we supplied during the long lockdown.

In St George we are working and networking with the Veterans Coalition, Utah Tech University Veterans Club, Rotary Veterans Club, the Veteran's Homeless Rep at the Vet Clinic and the City of Santa Clara where we have proposed a Veteran's Box Garden to be worked into a new park in Santa Clara. The Ivins VA Home is excited for the opportunity this will give their residents to get their hands dirty. The city has approved our plans. They will also include a flagpole monument to Veterans.

At the St George Lodge we have installed a large bulletin board for Veterans. We will post updates of interest to veterans, for example, Pact 22 news, new conditions from Agent Orange, the five new locations around the world that Agent Orange was used, Burn Pit's 20 identified locations and the drinking water issues at Camp Lejeune. I would recommend that each lodge install a bulletin board for veterans with information that may affect them.

The numbers usually presented have certainly been affected by the closure of the VA Homes and the restrictions at many of our retirement homes. Please note the following:




GRAND LODGE 2022 WAS GRAND



UEA President Eric Crocker & First Lady Natalie represented our state with dignity and the GER's call for enthusiasm.



VETERANS ARTICLE

This is my first article for the Utah State Newsletter. I will be writing to keep members and Veterans informed with what is going on at the VA. I hope that you will approve of this kind of information and look forward to hearing your comments.

On July 16, 2022, the new *Crisis Line* for Veterans was activated. The new number is **988**, and **then press1**. This number is for the use of Veterans, caregivers or family members. You may also text 838255. 988 is up and running in Utah and replaces 1-800-273-8255.

Congress has passed a new act and this one is titled Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring Our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics (PACT) Act of 2022. Under this Bill two new conditions for Agent Orange were added, High Blood Pressure (also called Hypertension) and Monoclonal Gammopathy of Undermined Significance (MGUS). This is not a single disorder but a group of disorders. In this condition there is abnormal activation of plasma cells and excessive build -up of gamma globulin.

Five new locations have been added to the list of contamination for Agent Orange:

Military Bases in Thailand January 9,1962 through June 30, 1976.

Laos December 1,1965 through September 30,1969.

Cambodia @ Mimot or Krek, Kampiong Chan Province April 16,1969 through April 30,1969.

Guam or American Samoa, waters off of them from January 9,1962 to July 30,1980.

Johnson Atoll on a ship that called there from January 1,1972 to September 30,1980.

If you served on active duty in any of these listed locations the VA will automatically assume or presume that you have been exposed to Agent Orange.

Here is a phone number for Veterans to call if their bank accounts are hacked and they are receiving a new account number from their bank (s). You need to notify the VA if you are receiving disability payments. The number is 1-800-827-1000. Veterans need to have their DD214 in front of them as they will be asked questions from the DD214 to verify their identity.

Please feel free to contact your Lodge Veterans Committee if you need assistance and/or contact me directly. Remember to always reach out to our Veterans with care and honor.

LITTLE WARRIORS CAMP

The Little Warriors Camp" is a program sponsored by the Utah Elks Veteran program. The children who attend this camp had Warriors who were killed in action or committed suicide due to P.T.S.D.

This year there were 110 total campers and over 175 total volunteers to make this camp such an incredible opportunity for children who have lost a parent in military combat or to military PTSD related suicide.

This beautiful camp is located in the mountains outside of Tooele. There are a large variety of volunteers who come just to work with these children to teach them a variety of skills and provide opportunities for them to try a sport in the beautiful outdoors that they may not have otherwise.

Among the many volunteers were; The Battlin Bettie's, Tooele City Royalty, in their beautiful gowns, Utah National Guard, Tooele, with a Rock Climbing Wall, Tooele Utah DNR, Tooele with Archery safety training as well as swimming and crafts, and the favorite zip line. The kids also got to learn how to bake cookies, make necklaces, bird feeders, tie dye shirts and hats and roast marshmallows around the campfire.
