As of the August 21, 2023, membership report we have 3695 current Elks in Utah. Our total gain was 167 members. This includes new members, affiliate members and reinstated members. This sounds like great news, but we lost 40 members and there are 482 unpaid members which brings us to 355 fewer Elks in Utah than we had last year.

Here is something that you could do to help. Get a list of the unpaid members to see if you personally know someone on that list. Reach out to that Elk and see why they didn't pay their dues. Maybe there is something that you can help them with.

Now for some good news, we have 95 candidates that are waiting for initiation across the state. In the words of Rick Gathen – INITIATE, INITIATE, INITIATE.

We are fast approaching our semi-annual dues deadline of October 1<sup>st</sup>. Follow up with these members and encourage them to renew their membership.

Each participant will receive a certificate of Participation for each essay entrant and monetary awards are \$1000 for first, \$500 for second and \$250 for third.

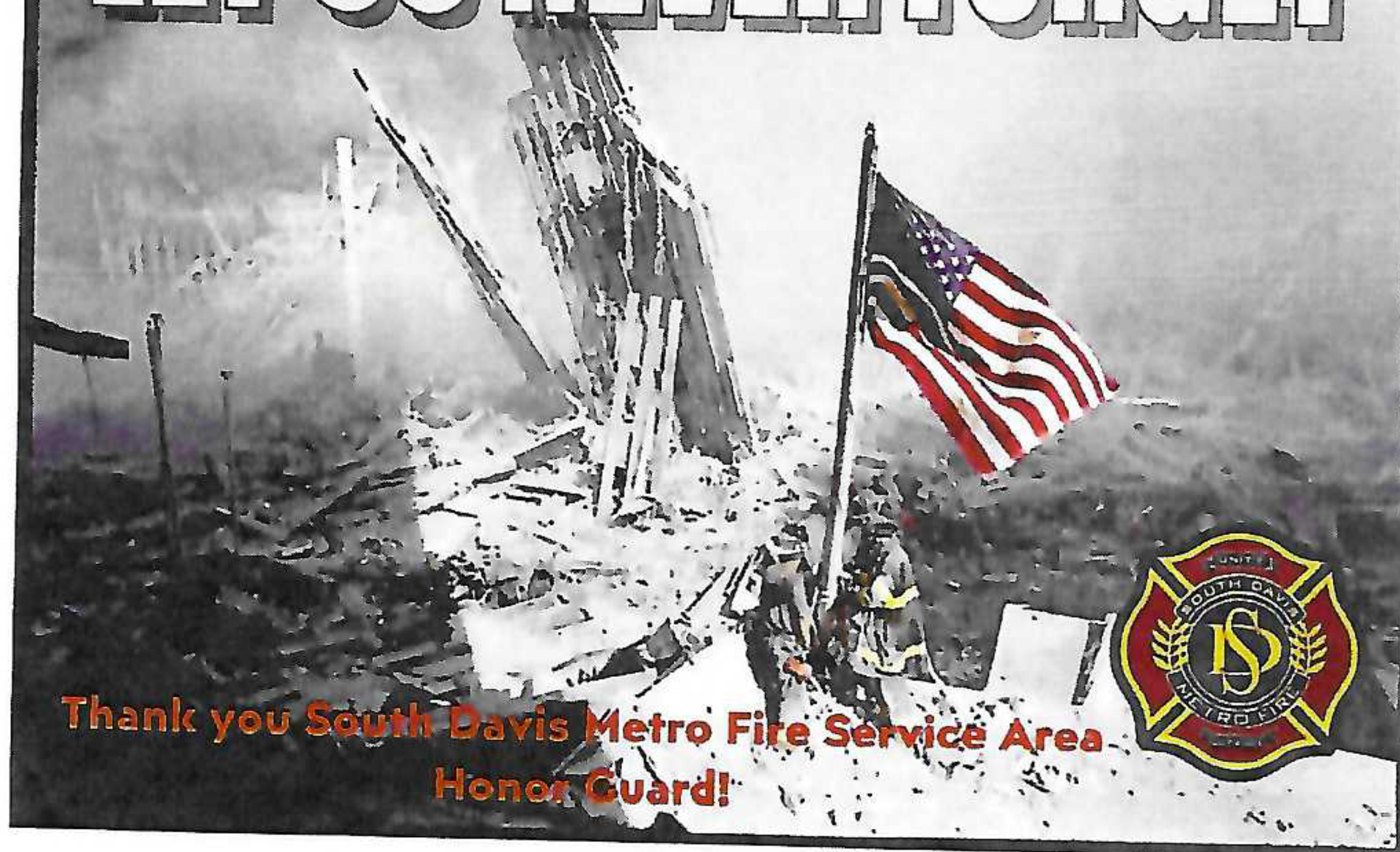
