STATE VETERANS COMMITTEE

This quarter has been very busy throughout the State with winter and the Holidays.

At the Ogden Home, the Veterans celebrated their Birthdays and were visited each month.

The Committee that volunteers at the Payson Home helped with a Halloween Party for over 800 kids plus parents and everyone had a great time. In December, the Committee purchased stockings for all the Veterans at the Home and filled them with candy and flashlights. They also contacted a local credit union who supplied each Veteran with a calendar. These treats were delivered on Christmas Eve.

The Committee who works at the Salt Lake City VAMA coordinated with the Homeless Veterans Department to purchase needed items for the winter. They purchased 21 pairs of boots, 14 pairs of gloves and 21 pairs of winter socks. They were also able to distribute 50 winter jackets that had been donated.

Volunteers from St George Lodge 1743 donated many hours to helping with programs at the Southern Utah Veterans Home in Ivins. They supply help to Bingo two days a week, a Birthday Cake and visit each month, assisted Veterans with shopping at Walmart, assisted the Veterans at restaurants for breakfast or lunch and travel in the vans for fun excursions to help with wheelchairs and walker dependent veterans. Additionally, we provided many volunteers to assist at the Halloween party with over 800 kids and parents. This is an annual event that the community looks forward to and we were able to provide eight volunteers, in costume, to help the Veterans and Trick or Treaters. Christmas was a busy time in Southern Utah as we held our Christmas Tree event again this year. 173 Veterans names were on the tree this year. The Stars with gift wishes were taken by Lodge members very quickly and Veterans at eight different homes and care facilities received much that they asked for. The Ivins Home allowed the Veterans Committee to deliver the gifts to each of the 100 Veterans at 8:30 a.m. on Christmas morning. What a great way to start this special day with a gift, a Merry Christmas wish, and a big smile. We were met with a sincere Thank you!
