Our volunteer Veterans Committees throughout the State have been very productive this past year as reflected in the following statistics:

Volunteers have donated 2,111 hours at the established equivalent rate of \$22 an hour which equals \$46,442. They have traveled 1,937 miles at a rate of 52 cents per mile equaling \$3,607.24 and have served 4,362 veterans. These numbers reflect the volunteer work at the VA Homes and the Salt Lake Medical Center. Note that the individual Lodge Veteran Committees report their hours locally and are not included here.

The Elks Commission to serve our Veterans is well demonstrated in Utah. We thank all who have contributed their time and efforts and encourage you to continue in this needed work.

We have a new Veterans Chair at the Ogden home. John McNally from Golden Spike Lodge has filled the spot and has provided birthday cakes at the Home and is looking for other ways to help the Veterans.

Veterans Chair at Payson, Bob Pagnani, is helping to sponsor a Car Show in June with an estimated attendance of 1000 people. Bob will also be purchasing items for veterans in need at the Salt Lake City Medical Center.

At the Southern Utah VA Home in Ivins, we will continue with what has become an annual replanting of the box gardens at Ivins. This year we were approached by veterans of two wings in the home with the request for vegetables. They miss their home gardens. The Home not only approved but also agreed to use any produce or herbs in their kitchen. The birds have returned to St George and so the request for bird seed has also arrived. The birds and Vets are now very happy.

St George Lodge #1743 has partnered with the Hope Reins Healing program by providing funding for equine therapy for veterans in the area that may benefit from this newer form of therapy.

Please note that we will be placing a new Veterans Chair at the Salt Lake Medical Center in the next month or two. Please contact me if you could take this on.

Again, thank you for your dedication to our Veterans as we look to another successful year.
