

2025 Most Valuable Student Scholarship Application is OPEN



Hello Utah Elks Association

I am looking forward to seeing each one of you at Camp Wapiti, during the UEA Fall meeting. Fall is an exciting time in the Elks organization because school is back in session and our lodges have already been busy helping their local schools through backpack programs, food pantries and the drug awareness program. Hoop shoot is just around the corner, Lodge Christmas charities will begin in less than 3 months.

For myself, this is an exciting time because of the Elks National Foundation Most Valuable Student Scholarship program.

The MVS application is available online now at www.elks.org and will remain open until November 12, 2024. It is time, once again for the Lodge Scholarship Chairman to get information out to the scholarship counselors in their local high schools. This year ENF will be awarding the following:

Packets for each Lodge's scholarship program have been mailed to the Lodge Secretary. If you are the chairman, this packet a great resource, please go through it carefully. There are posters and flyers about all the scholarships that you can distribute to the high schools in your area.

The ENF will be awarding Utah 3 Legacy Scholarships this year. Legacy Awards are \$4,000 scholarships available to children and grandchildren of Elks members. Eligibility requirements are outlined below.

The 2025 Legacy contest and application will open on September 1, 2024.

For the 2025 contest,

- Any child or grandchild (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the Order on or before April 1, 2022, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2022, is eligible to apply. The Elk must also be a paid-up member through March 31, 2025. Great-grandchildren are not eligible.
- The applicant must be a high school senior.
- The applicant must apply online only.
- The 2025 Legacy Awards application deadline is February 3, 2025, 11:59 a.m. Pacific Time. NOTE: This is NOON, mid-day, Pacific time.
- If the applicant's parent and grandparent are both Elk members, the applicant must apply through the parent's Elks Lodge.
- We have waived the standardized test requirement for the 2025 Legacy contest. You do not need to submit ACT and/or SAT scores.
- Students may apply for more than one ENF scholarship; however, they may win only one. In cases where the student wins more than one, we will award the scholarship with the greater value. Students can accept local and state scholarships, which are separate from the awards at the national level.
- Legacy Awards may only be applied to accredited US American schools, colleges or universities. (Note: Applicants from Panama, Puerto Rico and the Philippines may apply Legacy Awards toward schools, colleges or universities in their respective homes.)
- If you are selected as a 2025 Legacy Awards recipient, you will be required to perform three instances of service with an Elks Lodge during the four years you are receiving the scholarship.

“DEA Fentanyl Seizures in 2024

In 2023, DEA seized more than 80 million fentanyl-laced fake pills and nearly 12,000 pounds of fentanyl powder. The 2023 seizures are equivalent to more than 381 million lethal doses of fentanyl.

The 2024 fentanyl seizures represent over 200 million deadly doses.*

“The shift from plant-based drugs, like heroin and cocaine, to synthetic, chemical-based drugs, like fentanyl and methamphetamine, has resulted in the most dangerous and deadly drug crisis the United States has ever faced,” said DEA Administrator Anne Milgram. “At the heart of the synthetic drug crisis are the Sinaloa and Jalisco cartels and their associates, who DEA is tracking world-wide. The suppliers, manufacturers, distributors, and money launderers all play a role in the web of deliberate and calculated treachery orchestrated by these cartels. DEA will continue to use all available resources to target these networks and save American lives.”

After reading these facts I am confident no one believes that this is not happening in Utah and the importance of supporting our Drug Awareness chair in each of our lodges to get the word out to our communities. Please ask your DAP chair how you can help or contact me for any assistance.

Over 65 Little Warriors spent the weekend at Camp Wapiti in Settlement Canyon.

Little Warriors are Utah kids who lost a parent either to military action or post-traumatic stress-related suicide, according to Robert Pagnani, a member of the Utah Elks that sponsors the camp

and one of the camp's founders.

"We bring them to Wapiti for three days and give them lots of fun and love," Pagnani said, as he started to shed a tear.

The camp takes a lot of volunteers to run each year. This year, Pagnani said they had over 50 volunteers helping out.

Pagnani insists that the camp includes not just the kids but their families and close friends too.

At the camp, besides making new friends and meeting up with old ones, the Little Warriors participated in crafts, a Slide for Life, archery, swimming, a demonstration of police dogs by the Utah Department of Corrections, and other exciting events.

Out of 117 kids in Utah that fall into the Little Warrior category, around 65 attended the camp from July 19-21.

Tooele City royalty presented crowns to some of the girls, and cowboy hats were presented to boys by cowboys from Grantsville. The Tooele City mayor, the Dugway Proving Ground and Tooele

Army Depot commanders, as well as the Utah Director of Veterans and Military Affairs, visited the camp and mingled with the Little Warriors.

Lunch for everyone on Saturday was provided by the Walmart Distribution Center and its volunteers. Saturday lunch also featured a giant cake celebrating Little Warriors 10th anniversary.

MEMBERSHIP


