UEA State Scholarships Committee Report

Fall Meeting 2025

Members and Guests:

It is scholarship time again for the Elks Most Valuable Student, Legacy and UEA scholarships. Our budget of \$44,000 has been approved.

The on-line ENF scholarship has been available since August 1st of this year. It will continue to be available until November 12, 2025.

Lodge judging will be December 3rd thru December 22nd

District judging will be from January 2nd thru January 13th

State judging will be from February 5th thru February 23rd

National judging will take place from March 13th thru March 23rd.

Once the national judging is complete, I will have the finalists at Spring meeting in March and will be handing out certificates. Applications are available on line at elks.org/enf/scholarships

The online applications for ENF Legacy scholarship will become available on September 1st. The deadline for the Legacy scholarship is February 2nd. Judging for the Legacy scholarship is done entirely by ENF and is announced in late April. Utah may be awarded up to three Legacy scholarships. I encourage members in good standing with children and grandchildren, including step-children, step-grandchildren or legal ward who are high school seniors to apply for this scholarship. This scholarship is for \$1,000 per year for 4 years. This application may be found on the ENF website at elks.org/enf/scholarships.

The ENF website also has information available for the Weigel Medical scholarship as well as the Emergency scholarship

The UEA scholarship is for high school seniors that are in a vocational or alternative high school, have a documented mental or physical disability or are in financial hardship. This scholarship is funded by ENF money and gives us a chance to assist these students with their educational goals. The application is open now and wil1 be closed on January 31, 2026. Applications may be found by googling Utah Elks Association and the link to the UEA application is in red.

I encourage all scholarship chairman to visit the Elks National foundation website and become familiar. There are some excellent scholarship resources and tutorials as well as a place to order pamphlets and posters regarding ENF scholarships.

Provided Move-in Kits to veterans that graduated the program and, also provided a travel kit and ticket for a veteran for a long ride home from the hospital after his discharge. Volunteers also took veterans to a Pioneer Days Rodeo and provided refreshments.

Volunteers at the Payson Home stuffed 1,000 plastic eggs with candy for Easter. There were over 500 kids and family members at the event, and everyone had a great time. Plans to do some fishing trips over the summer became an awesome time for residents who caught lots of fish. On other trips the veterans caught their limits, and they ended the trips with a Fish Fry. June, the Payson Home held a car show with 100 cars and over 800 people showed.

At the Ogden Home an Easter Egg Hunt was held for the kids in the area. The Committee supplied candy and the Easter Bunny. The Elks supplied 30 red shirts for a special event and gave the veterans the opportunity to paint the shirts for the June 11th Flag Day event.

The Southern Utah Veterans Home our volunteers visited twice weekly to help with Bingo and visit with the veterans. We also worked with the Dementia Wing at the Home. We continue with the tradition of supplying a Birthday Cake each month and had a few trips to Walmart with veterans who enjoy getting out to shop for bits and pieces and love talking to others as they shop. Some of us finish early and meet at the Subway in the store to share a soda and stories. We continue to purchase and supply candy for Bingo prizes and birdseed to keep both birds and veterans happy. We're glad to report that the garden boxes we planted this year are doing well, with the exception of the vegetables. Just too much heat for them this year. We also helped supply money for haircuts.
